

Director's Note

Love's Labor's Lost found me in a really dark time. It came to me as a gift from my one friend at an abusive job, and the small, blue-bound script sat on my desk for the rest of my time there and then nestled in my bookbag after I got out. I kept going back to it, giggling at the foolish men and mischievous women who got to focus on their silly love lives while I struggled to make the bare minimum. It was a welcome escape in an awful time.

As I grew healthier, I began to connect with the show in a new way. I was drawn to the expectations the Lords had of their world and a woman's place in it. Ideas echoing in the modern age of internet forums and radical masculinity. Ideas I knew all too well. Ideas I hated. But the script immediately challenged those ideas. The Princess of France demands respect on her merits from the moment she steps on stage! Rosaline runs circles around the "Merry Madcap Lord" Berowne, and Kate & Maria stand tall against the archaic desires of their suitors. These Ladies refused to conform to the world they were put in and brought the audience along for the ride as they tore it down. They are powerful women. They remind me of the women I've looked up to all my life. They remind me of me.

It is not lost on me that we get to put on this show in June. And I am so PROUD of the wonderful people I get to tell this story with. People who share my experiences. People who have brought their own diverse experiences into the room and told the story through their own lenses. They have shared of themselves and transformed this show into a celebration of the many ways we interact with and challenge the strict roles we are expected to fill.

I hope that people walk away from this show feeling just a bit lighter. With the idea that maybe by seeing things as they are, and not forcing our expectations onto them, we can lose some of the bitterness the world calls us towards. That if we can accept love and happiness for what they are, we will be able to find the peace they bring more easily. And I hope people can start to find that peace through laughter, just like I did when I first encountered this incredible play!

How did Shakespeare contribute to the development of Romantic Comedies? In this preshow lecture, Dr. Buhler will count some of the ways with the help of Richard Curtis's classic Christmas rom-com film, *Love Actually*. Multiple but related story lines, complicated relationships, a mix of nationalities, misinterpreted notes, unresolved situations, the challenges of class difference, shrewd references to popular culture, acknowledgments of tragedy along with plenty of laughs – they are all present in Shakespeare, as well as in Curtis. We promise that there will be no serious spoilers, at least regarding *Love's Labor's Lost*.

Dr. Buhler has signed an oath to that effect. (Wait, was that a spoiler?)




